

Before moving his roving developer's eye to the Great Southern, Graeme developed 'quality' housing that regional Western Australian towns in the north are famous for. Such as witnessed in Karratha, Newman and Port Hedland. He then developed the **dolphin industry** at Monkey Mia. He was blocked in his plans to develop Ningaloo Reef.

Graeme did not rest easy after moving to this area. The countless opportunities to turn local resources into cash have kept him busy. **Local groups opposed to him** have cost a small portion of his profit after insisting on local objections be heard and decisions made locally. In a number of **contested developments**, from Ningaloo to the Nullaki, Graeme has not had kind words to say about **local interference** in his money making schemes.

He has suggested that local civil servants are just upset that they **can't afford the blocks** on his developments and that community spaces are in his words 'just places that people dump empty coke bottles'.
